THE LAB's first predecessor project was "SAM" in 2012 with guest artist Julie Slick of the Adrian Belew Power Trio. The next evolution was
"NOTOPIA" in 2015. Guest artists were Mike Keneally (Frank Zappa, Joe Satriani, Steve Vai) and prog rock legend Peter Hammill.
These sessions resulted in three albums calld "Another Life", "Yet Another Life" and finally "Celebrating Life".

All of these projects and recordings are made ignoring the usual rules of the music business. It is not about money and fame; it is about the moment and the art.
